Computed tomography (CT) scanning of the head uses a series of x-rays of the head taken from many different directions. Typically used for quickly viewing brain injuries, CT scanning uses a computer program that performs a numerical integral calculation (the inverse Radon transform) on the measured x-ray series to estimate how much of an x-ray beam is absorbed in a small volume of the brain.

In patients with chronic steno-occlusive disease, the ability to maintain normal cerebral blood flow by reducing vascular resistance secondary to autoregulatory vasodilation is compromised.

Cerebral amyloid angiopathy (CAA) is an important but underrecognized cause of cerebrovascular disorders that predominantly affect elderly patients. CAA results from deposition of β -amyloid protein in cortical, subcortical, and leptomeningeal vessels. This deposition is responsible for the wide spectrum of clinical symptoms and neuroimaging findings.

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
